I have an extensive record of Christian and community services as Chaplain of the Student Council Government of CWA in 1992 and 1993, Ordained minister in 2001, and Pastor of the New Tabernacle Christ Pentecostal Church for seven years. I also served as Chaplain of the Youth Desk and Executive Member of the Liberian Council of Churches.

I formed the Fellowship of War Affected Christians serving as its executive director. I worked in youth development, peacebuilding, and mediation as Youth Coordinator of the Inter-Religious Council of Liberia 2004 to 2008 and the West African Inter-Religious Coordinating Committee 2005 to 2007. I served as Secretary-General of the Liberian Ministers Association of the Delaware Valley 2014 to 2018, the Program Coordinator, Liberia Ministerial Alliance in North America 2018 to present, and currently the Development Director of All for All Agency building capacity.

I graduated with the Class of 92/93. I received a bachelor's in theology from the Liberia Baptist Theological Seminary in 1999, a Master of Arts in Peacebuilding and Conflict Transformation from the SIT Graduate Institute in Brattleboro, Vermont, and a Master of Arts in Sustainable Development in 2019.
